Education


Identifying continuing education possibilities and retreats in light of concerns and ministry goals of the pastor, congregation, synod and ELCA.

When I was raped, I didn't tell a soul for nearly 10 years. I have written long and hard about it, but I have not wanted to share that story yet. I still don't want to share about it now. I can count on my hands the number of people who know about it.	There will be more suffering. There will be more deaths - either from lack of care, from desperate and unsafe remedies, or from suicide.
Had it been today, had I gotten pregnant, had I been in one of a number of states in this country, my choices would be few. Some states have allowed for abortions in the case of rape. The future is still very unclear in Michigan, but I am not holding my breath. The Michigan law that is currently blocked by a judge from going into effect does not have an exception in the case of rape.	I would have loved to share about the praying mantises, and the asparagus that won't quit. The thought of it, of ignoring the loss of bodily autonomy, makes me feel sick. I'd rather say nothing.
I imagine, in those places that do, that there is some obligation to prove rape. Historically, that is not easy. Two thirds of rapes are not even reported to police. Per 1000 rapes, only 50 lead to arrest, and of those 50 arrests, only 28 lead to a felony conviction. In the United States, 1 in 6 women have been the victim of a attempted or completed rape in her lifetime. (Statistics from RAINN - Rape, Abuse, and Incest National Network, where you can find the upsetting statistics relating to children).	
For me, this is a thought exercise. For countless others, this is the reality they face. We already don't believe women. I don't doubt that there are those who would not believe me. I was 19 when it happened and I was forever changed. It still haunts me at times. There are those who feel compelled to carry a pregnancy that is the product of rape to term. They can choose to do so, but we have absolutely no business prolonging the rape and forcing that upon someone.
